

Chairman's Welcome

This year's Festival promises to be bigger, better and even more exciting than in previous years due to hard work by the committee and increased support from local organisations and businesses. A BIG THANK YOU to you all who have worked tirelessly to ensure the Festival is a big success.

Even with the continuing economic crisis we have been able to secure more entertainment and activities for adults and children alike. The festival commences on Saturday 3rd July with a street parade. This year's theme "outer space", will be reflected in the parade and a number of window displays throughout the town. The parade headed by a Marching Band will lead to the King George V Playing Field and includes school children and dancers many in fancy dress, plus classic cars, samba band and the new community bus.

The afternoon arena events are aimed at giving all-round family entertainment with a free band concert in the evening. On Sunday 4th July we hold the 10K run when in excess of 400 hundred runners will participate. In line with the festival theme Dr Heather Couper and Nigel Henbest will be presenting a lecture entitled Cosmic Quest – A History of Astronomy in the Community Centre. This celebrated couple have kindly donated their time prior to jetting off the next day to witness a total eclipse of the sun in Tahiti.

Saturday 10th July sees the Street Fayre with an array of stalls, rides, circus entertainers, a theatre group, local bands and singers suitable for all ages. For the youngsters as in previous years a chocolate hunt takes place at Whiteleaf Cross on Sunday 11th July.

Throughout the whole Festival week many local organisations, businesses and schools will be hosting a number of special events and open days. Please come along and support as many events as possible, most are free and promise to be great fun but a donation to support our charity Risborough Cares would be greatly appreciated.
